- Tim Peake is a British astronaut. He spent 6 months living on the International Space Station.

- Significance:** an important event or person that should be remembered.
- Famous:** someone known by many people.
- Voyage:** a long journey involving travel by sea.
- Explorer:** a person who explores a new or unfamiliar area.
- Astronaut:** a person who goes into, and explores, space.
