- *Ready to progress Covid Recovery focusing on:*

- Multiplication & division

- All mathematical concepts will be taught with the use of concrete resources and pictorial methods. Ongoing 'problem solving' activities are embedded into daily lessons.

Computing

- Understand that data can be represented in picture format.
- Contribute to a class pictogram and use a pictogram to record results.
- Write their own simple algorithm.
- Know that unexpected outcomes are due to code they have created and make logical attempts to fix (debug) the code.

Music

- Listen to music from the Romantic period.
- Maintain a pulse while listening to a rhythm and aurally identify rests in familiar songs.
- Begin to recognise and discuss inter-related dimensions of music including pitch, duration, dynamics, tempo, timbre and structure.

History

- Recognise the distinction between present and past in their own and other people's lives (leisure and tourism in Victorian times).
- Identify some similarities and differences between ways of life in different periods (seaside resorts now and then).
- Know where some people and events fit into a chronological framework.
- Use and make simple comparisons to parts of stories and features of events (aspects of leisure such as ice creams and the penny lick).
- Understand historical concepts and make simple connections or draw contrasts (between Victorians and themselves).

RE

- What do Sikhs believe?
- To find out about Sikhs and how Sikhism began.
- To find out what being equal means to a Sikh.
- To find out why Sikhs meditate.

Art

- Create a seaside collage/textile piece of work, using a range of fabric and textures.
- Studying artists who use the seaside to inspire their works of art.
