Some historians consider the origin of holidays to be the medieval pilgrimage; a journey which was made to a shrine in order to pray, ask for forgiveness for sins, or to be cured of some illness. Although pilgrimages were undertaken for religious reasons, the experience did take people away from their everyday lives.</p> <p>The Seaside Holiday During the eighteenth century, it became a common belief that sea water, like the spa waters of towns such as Bath and Buxton, had medicinal properties and could benefit those of a delicate constitution. King George III made frequent trips to Weymouth in an attempt to restore his failing health and the Prince Regent (later to become George IV) went frequently to Brighton to bathe in the sea.</p>
