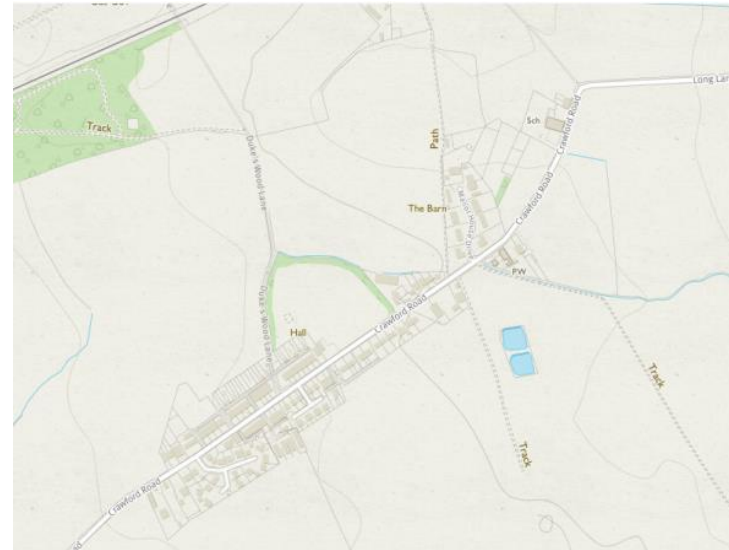

Key Facts

Crawford village is a rural village situated on the border of Merseyside and Lancashire. It has a community of approx. 200 houses, a school, a community centre and playing fields. Crawford Village is home to 5 different businesses. There are 15 recycling centres across Lancashire where householders can recycle their rubbish. In Lancashire recycling centres When you deposit your waste, ownership of it passes to Lancashire County Council. Any items deposited may be retained for reuse or recycling in order to reduce what is sent for disposal. Everything that goes in your rubbish bin has a cost to collect and dispose of it. Last year in Lancashire, we collected just over 405,000 tonnes of waste from households and our household waste recycling centres (HWRCs). The annual cost of disposing Lancashire's household waste is almost £37 million.

Key vocabulary

- Aerial view: Also known as a bird's eye view. This is the viewpoint seen at a high elevation.
- International: existing, occurring, or carried on between nations.
- Key: A map key is a little box of information found at the bottom of a map. It contains an explanation of what the different lines and symbols on the map mean, as well as a scale for you to work out distance.
- land use: How land is used.
- Local: relating or restricted to a particular area or one's neighbourhood.
- National relating to or characteristic of a nation; common to a whole nation.
- 16-point compass terms: N, NNE, NE, ENE, E, ESE, SE, SSE, S, SSW, SW, WSW, W, NWN, NW, and NNW.
- grid reference: a set of numbers used to find particular places on a map
- land use: what land is used for (such as housing, recreation, farming, etc.)
