

What?

Research is occurring on coral reefs situated in the sea surrounding the US Virgin Islands. Coral reefs are underwater structures made up of tiny organisms called coral polyps. They live in big groups and stick together to create the reef form.



Scientists at the site have discovered that coral larvae were seven times more likely to settle in reef areas where recordings of thriving ocean ecosystem sounds were played. This includes fish noises, like snaps and grunts, which were audible from speakers placed by researchers.

It is hoped this development will help protect reefs around the US Virgin Islands and beyond. Researcher, Nadege Aoki said, "We're hoping this may be something we can combine with other efforts to put the good stuff back on the reef.

ODD:ZZ:

Why?

The world has lost 50% of its coral reefs since the 1950s. Scientists explain this loss is caused by pollution, climate change, overfishing, habitat loss and coral bleaching.

Coral bleaching happens when water becomes too warm, and corals reject the algae living within them. This causes the coral to turn white (bleached). If the water remains too warm, the algae cannot go back, putting the coral reef at risk of being permanently destroyed.

This research is important because coral reefs play important roles in oceans. They provide a habitat for organisms, and protect coastal areas by lessening the intensity of waves that arrive at the coast. Reefs create jobs for people to protect and research them, encourage tourism, and contribute to medicine ingredients.
