

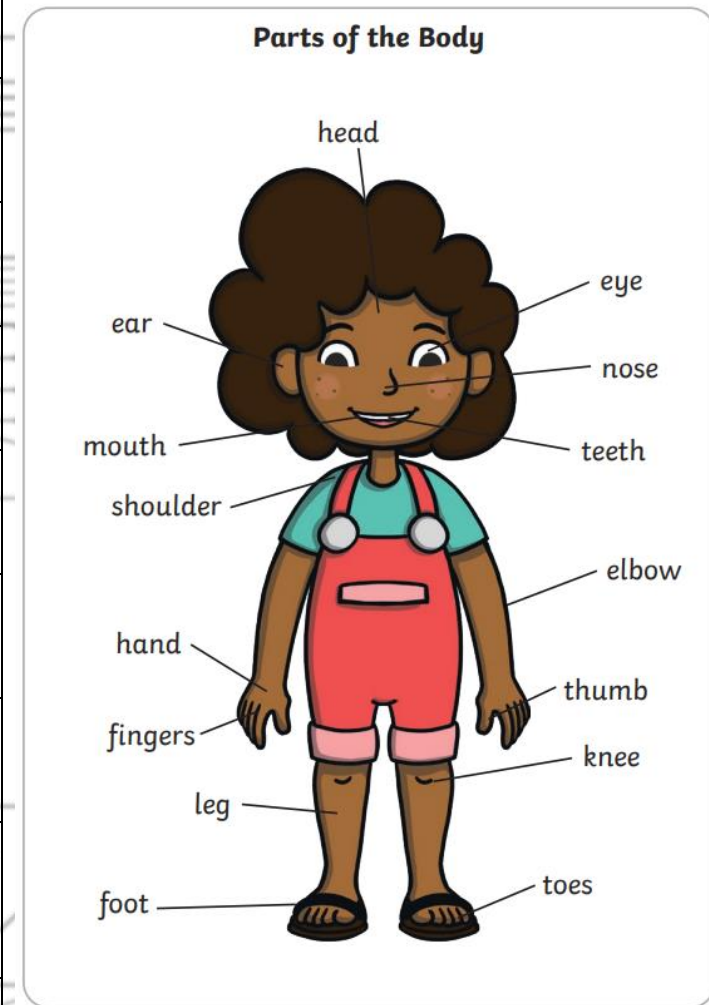
Key Facts – What you need to know

- Identify, name, draw and label the basic parts of the human body and say which part of the body is associated with each sense.
- Recognise that humans are animals.
- Compare and describe differences in their own features (eyes, hair, skin etc).
- Recognise that humans have many similarities.

Key Vocabulary

Mammals	Mammals are animals that breathe air, grow hair or fur and feed on their mother's milk as a baby.
Sense	Any of the five ways to experience or understand the world around you.
Sight	Your eyes let you see the world around you.
Hearing	Your ears let you listen to all the things around you.
Touch	Your skin gives you the sense of touch.
Taste	Your sense of taste comes from your tongue.
Smell	You smell using your nose.
Human body	The human body comes in different shapes and sizes but are made from the same parts that do the same job.
Human features	Parts of the body that can be different such as eyes, hair and skin.

Observe	Using our senses to gather information and collect data from the natural world.
Describe	Write in words or give someone a verbal explanation of your observations.
Record	Putting down your findings in writing and creating some other permanent of your findings.
Compare	Estimate, measure or note the similarities and differences between things that are being observed.
